This is the future home of the London Visual Arts Guild. If all goes well with the City of London and the LVAG, the new building for the gallery will be ours in October 2019.

A few items still remain to be finalized but the target for date of occupancy is projected to be October 1st. This will hopefully be followed by a fundraiser and limited open house on the 6th of October.

The event will occupy the large front yard of the new building located at 121 E. First St.

There will be over a 2,000 sq. ft. increase in useable floor space and ample room to add additional art venues and classes. There is much work to be done and the plan is to have everything completed and ready to go by next April, even sooner if it is necessary.

In order to enlighten the community concerning the future plans for the London Visual Arts Guild, we are holding an event at the new site.

We would like the public to visit our new venue and join us in a small celebration of our good fortune. There will be additional information available on our future plans at the new site. We are planning activities for the entire family and there will also be food and drinks available.

The location of the building also gives us ample parking in two different areas. Parking is available on First Street in front of the building and also a large area in the rear which is accessed by the city building. This is also a great advantage over the building we presently occupy.

The date is October 6, the time is 3:00pm to 6:00pm. We plan to have the building open for viewing. So, you may see our new gallery area if you drop by and join the fun.

And last, but maybe the most enjoyable of the day, is the music. The entertainment we have chosen for our visitors is in the form of the duo 'Terra Jazz'. Terra Jazz is Ashley Kennedy and Jeff Hershey. The following is an excerpt from their bio.

This versatile duo plays an eclectic blend of classic jazz/swing and contemporary hit songs. Ashley shines as a vocalist and Jeff dazzles as pianist, and that is just where the music ambrosia begins. To her voice, Ashley adds a mixture of rhythm guitar, the melodica, a bit of violin accoutrement, and piano. Jeff, an artist and art gallery owner, also creates audible art with his harmonica.

There will be much more information forthcoming in the next couple weeks as well as invitations and posters showing what we are offering for your enjoyment.

We are treating this as our first fundraiser for our new venue so come and help us reintroduce the 'London Visual Arts Guild' to the city of London, Ohio.
